Elections

The Abriachan Forest Trust is managed by a board of Trustees and our constitution states that every year a third of our Trustees must stand down. If this is their first term of office, they may be eligible for re-election but no trustee can be in office for more than two consecutive terms. Trustees must be on the electoral roll for the Parish of Abriachan and their nomination forms must be signed by 2 members. Cotton grass

If you have had a walk up the hill paths towards the top of Carn na Leitire you will have noticed that this has been a good year for bog cotton or cotton grass- which is actually a sedge.



In Abriachan there are two species of cotton- sedge. Hare's tail cotton- sedge which has one pure white head like a hare's tail and flowers in April and May. The other species is the Common cotton-sedge which appears later in the summer and has 3-7 umbels. The Gaelic name for the cotton-sedges is *canach* from the word for white. It is also known as *Siodha monah* mountain silk and the heads were collected and the fibres woven into cloth. The heads were also used to stuff mattresses and pillows.

Black Grouse

In Abriachan we are fortunate to have a small number of black grouse. There had been a sharp decline in the population in the 1990s and only recently have we seen the numbers pick up again. The cotton-sedges are an important food source for black grouse during early spring and some of the birds nest on the high ground. We would ask all dog walkers to keep your dogs on the lead during spring and early summer when you are on the hill ground because our red and black grouse need all the help they can to have a successful breeding season.
